NEL FRANCES LINDNER

RICHMOND, 1926 - 2016

Beloved long-time member of the College Hill neighborhood, Nel Frances Lindner Richmond died peacefully on February 12, 2016 at age 89. Nel was a vital force in the College Hill community where she and her husband Robert lived for almost 48 years. She worked tirelessly to improve and promote the neighborhood she loved so dearly. She served as the first treasurer of the College Hill Neighborhood Association and chaired the Boswell Square Wall of Fame committee for many years. Following are highlights from her published obituary.

Born in Carrollton, Missouri she moved to Kansas with her parents. "In Garden City, Nel married Maurice W. Lindner, a farmer and stockman, on March 30, 1947. He died on February 8, 1964." "As a widow with three children," Nel began working for local businesses and "was the secretary for the Garden City Chamber of Commerce." "On January 19, 1968, she married Robert W. Richmond, an author, educator, and historian, whom she had met in the fourth grade in Wellington, Kansas." They moved with her children to a beautiful three story home in Topeka's historic College Hill neighborhood, in which Mr. Richmond still resides.

"She enjoyed her Westminster Presbyterian Church community and committees, the Topeka Symphony League, and Nautilus Club. The Kansas City Royals have lost their biggest fan. Nel loved and supported all things involving Washburn University, including the Kappa Sigma Mothers Club. She worked tirelessly for the College Hill Wall of Fame. She brought her extended Frazier family to Topeka every other July 4th for the Frazier Fling where the College Hill parade and Boswell fireworks were enjoyed by everyone. The fling will go forth this year in her honor."

SAFETY TIPS

Leave your porch lights on!

Help light the neighborhood, the sidewalk and your house.

Trim bushes & trees!

Keep bushes trimmed down to 3 ft. & tree branches up to 7 ft.

Make your house visible. Make sure your house numbers are visible to all emergency vehicles. House numbers should be on front & back — this includes the alley!

Lock It. Remove It or Lose It.

Always lock your vehicle, home and garage! Don't leave valuables in plain sight.

Keep your license plate safe!

Use anti-theft screws to secure your plate to your car. These screws can be found at local hardware stores. Don't forget the specific drill bit to secure to your vehicle. Or use two different screws, so thieves need two different tools to take the plate.

Keep our neighborhood safe!

Report all suspicious activity, vandalism or crime to our neighborhood officer. Even if the incident has passed.

FIRE SAFETY

Smoke Detectors Test smoke detector batteries twice a year during daylight savings time, do so by pressing the test button on the face of the smoke detector. If the test fails to sound the alarm or the detector is sounding a chirping sound, replace the batteries immediately. If the smoke detector is ten years old or older, it is recommended to replace the whole smoke detector with a new unit. (You can see the manufacture date on the back of the smoke detector after it is taken off of the detector mount.)

Hard Wired Detectors Detectors that are wired into home electrical systems; make certain they have a battery backup. Test batteries twice a year during daylight savings time, if test fails, do as stated before. If hard wired detectors do not have a battery backup, it is recommended to purchase a battery powered detector for a backup.
