A TRIBUTE TO SALLY ZELLERS

The unexpected death of Sally Zellers has left a void in College Hill and in many of our lives. She was an invaluable friend, resource, and leader in this neighborhood. Her quick wit and upbeat attitude brought people together to find solutions. For decades Sally and her husband Don have helped us keep College Hill safe. What started as neighborhood watch, then stroll patrols, and for 20+ years as the chairs of the CH safety committee, ultimately became Sally's full-time career as director of Safe Streets for 17 years and later the NET Reach Program in East Topeka. She was trained as an arbitrator in neighbor disputes, and was a nationally sought after speaker at conferences on safety. She also had a trusted relationship with Topeka law enforcement. Like many of us, she loved this neighborhood and championed its accomplishments to city groups. Every year she and Marsha Sheahan would bring a bus load of the new Leadership Topeka class to College Hill. We would dazzle the members with stories of College Hill leadership including a celebrated partnership forged with the city, USD 501, Parks & Rec, Westminster Presbyterian, and the neighborhood to create Boswell Square Park. They hoped our successes would motivate other neighborhoods. On a more personal level many of us knew her from her friendly, caring presence in our neighborhood. For years she and her running buddy, Kari, could be seen exercising in the early morning, and later in the day she and Don were frequent walkers. She always stopped to visit with anyone and I still look out my window hoping to see her walking by. She worked all the neighborhood events, and she and Don even chose to be married in Boswell Square. Yes, there is a void in College Hill without her, but she taught us so many lessons about being a good neighbor that her legacy will continue!

REMEMBERING HELEN JENSEN By Brendan Jensen

Helen Jensen was a remarkable lady who lived in College Hill for 50+ years in the home her father built in the early 1920s. She attended both Randolph Elementary and Boswell Jr. High before eventually graduating from Washburn with a Master's in Education. She taught in the Topeka area, including USD 501. Though she retired in 1983, she continued to volunteer long after and received the Topeka Friends of Education Award in 2004. She was also an accomplished pilot — a rare feat for women in her day. Many of us on Jewell remember her reading on her porch swing and riding her big black bicycle around the neighborhood. Her love of College Hill has resulted in at least three sets of Jensen's calling the neighborhood home. She leaves us with a legacy of service to her community and a great many fond memories.

17TH STREET MARKERS

College Hill residents are proud of our past and the neighborhood we have become. This summer, two limestone markers will be placed on the outermost median islands on 17th St. between Washburn and MacVicar Avenues. The markers will stand approximately 4' tall. When the street medians were built with the reconstruction of 17th St., concrete bases were laid anticipating the marker's placement. The medians were funded with College Hill Neighborhood Association funds and a \$2,500 City of Topeka grant. The limestone was selected to compliment the many Washburn campus buildings and the bus benches along the street. Stay tuned! College Hill neighbors will celebrate this event with an unveiling!
