The next College Hill recycling drive will be Saturday, March 26, beginning at 9 a.m.

Even if you haven't saved recyclable metals in the past for our neighborhood, it's not too late to get started now! Please have your sorted recyclables on your porch and visible from the street by 9 a.m.

To help our recycling volunteers, please sort your metals ahead of time.

Types of metals accepted and the way the recycling company needs us to sort them:

- Aluminum beverage cans all together.
- Steel cans, cat food and tuna fish cans, aluminum foil and pie pans all together (and separate from aluminum beverage cans).
- Other metals (aluminum sheeting and storm doors, copper pipes and fittings, anything bronze, etc.) separate from the other recyclable metals.
- We are unable to take appliances, hot water heaters, and other very heavy items.

RESULTS FROM RECENT RECYCLING DRIVE

Results from the December 2021 Recycling Drive:

- Aluminum cans: 219 lbs. @ 45 cents/lb. \$98.55
- Misc. metals: 220 lbs. @ 7.5 cents/lb. \$16.50

Total \$115.00

Recycling in College Hill for over 30 years! Compared to the September 2021 drive, we collected approximately 30 more pounds of aluminum and were paid a little more for the aluminum and miscellaneous metals (45 cents and 7.5 cents/pound, respectively, compared to 40 cents and 6 cents/pound earlier). As a result, we earned \$29 more this drive. Since the neighborhood recycling drives began in September 1990, our College Hill Neighborhood Association has received \$14.491.08 from recycling! We are hopeful that we will pass the \$15,000 mark in 2022!

Thank you! We thank and appreciate all the people who contributed their recyclables. But we still would love to get more neighbors to contribute theirs. We were pleased that most recyclers are sorting their materials the way we've been asked to do.

BOSWELL SQUARE PARK: DON'T MISS THE IMPROVEMENTS!

Boswell Square Park has a long standing history in College Hill.

"Boswell Junior High School was constructed in 1922 to serve as a grade school. It was located in the 1300 block of Boswell in the Boswell addition. In 1926, Boswell was officially transformed into a junior high school. Red and white were the school's colors and the mascot was the Wildcats. The junior high stood for 59 years until it was razed as part of Topeka's plan to consolidate and reorganize middle school districts and boundaries throughout the city." Kansas Historical Society

This nice weather is perfect for getting out and enjoying our neighborhood park. While you are there, be on the lookout for a few park improvements. Shawnee County Parks and Recreation has budgeted improvements in parks across the city and it is Boswell Park's turn. At the Chili Feed in 2019, neighbors were asked what they would like to see improved in the park. The top ideas were gazebo improvements, natural play areas, lighting and fencing. We shared these ideas with Parks and Rec and they continued to work with the neighborhood over the last year to learn more about what improvements we would like to see happen. In early 2022 all the hard work started to pay off as we saw the fence replaced and new light poles installed on the east and west edges of the park. Still to come, we will be getting a new larger gazebo and other playground improvements that we hope to see in place by the July 4th celebrations. Parks and Rec will continue to work with the neighborhood to develop some natural play areas in the park. Boswell Park was made possible by a few determined neighbors to see that a park was created when the Boswell Jr High building was torn down. Since then, the park has become a gem of the neighborhood. These improvements will ensure the park is enjoyed for years to come.
